#### Art Statement of Intent:

- To provide children with a knowledge of influential artists, designers, cultures and art movements across history.
- Encourage children to make critical responses.
- To develop children's proficiency in drawing, painting, printing and sculpture.
- To encourage children's curiosity about the world around them and developindependence and self-reflection.
- To develop a sound understanding of key elements of art and design including line, tone, texture, colour, pattern, shape.
- Develop children's ability to produce their own original responses.

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## Implementation:

Our art curriculum is skills based where key skills and processes are taught progressively throughout the year groups through quality and engaging lessons. Activities within the lessons, provide opportunities for children to explore and develop confidence within the key areas of art as well providing a broad and balanced knowledge of artists and works of art.

Our choice of artists and designers have been carefully considered to provide children with a wide coverage of history, culture and art movements. The artists selected for each year group provide chance for children's understanding of ideas and narratives behind works to become more sophisticated. Artists whose techniques are more technically challenging or ideas more complex are encountered as the children get older.

Children will be encouraged to express their individual creativity by producing various art pieces that explore and build on their developing understanding and ability. Sketchbooks will collect evidence of the individual's progression and of aspects covered throughout the years. Larger scale art work will be encouraged and photographed.
